We reflected on CHAI's growth from one group home for four residents to nine group homes for 31 residents. CHAI's impact has grown since our founding, in 1983, to reach more residents, more families, and the community at large.















A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT AND CEO

Dear CHAI Community:

2023 was the year of the strategic plan for CHAI. Our board decided to use a portion of our challenge grant to hire a renowned consultant to develop a five-year strategic plan. The consultant began the process by conducting an in-depth survey with CHAI's families, staff, donors, stakeholders, CEO's, rabbis and community leaders to determine what CHAI should look like in

the future. In April, we hosted a board retreat led by the consultant, where we put together initial ideas of CHAI's goals and strategies. In June, we held a staff retreat to discuss how the plan would be implemented and who would be accountable for each outcome. Once all of the pieces were in place, the consultant created a draft of our plan including four goals with detailed tactics and a dashboard to measure our success. She also created a one-page document outlining the highlights that we were able to post on our website and give people an introduction to what CHAI's plan includes in a digestible format. In August, after a year of hard work, our board voted to approve the strategic plan. We have been monitoring our progress at each board meeting and are proud to report all is on track!

In June, our annual fundraiser was held at Southfork Ranch, celebrating CHAl's 40-year history. We had 80 first-time attendees come to celebrate with us. The CHAI residents created beautiful paintings that were offered in a silent auction at the event. During the fall we hosted a Past Presidents Lunch, where we updated our past leaders on CHAI's future and discussed areas where they might be able to participate.

We are excited to announce we had a donor opportunity to add a ninth home to the CHAI community. The female side of the Todd House is now called the Alan M. Utay House. The home was generously donated by Sam Utay in memory of her husband Alan.

In addition, we moved our day program (Individual Skills and Socialization) to the Jewish Community Center (JCC) beginning March 1, 2023. We moved into a large space and now accommodate 15 residents. Our new space allows us to integrate with programming at the JCC (preschool, seniors, and athletics). Our residents also continue to go on outings in the community twice a week.

We have continued to have a resident speak at each board meeting to give them a chance to share about their CHAI experience and help the board get to know a bit more about each resident. We have had very positive feedback from the board from these interactions. In an effort to improve our communication with families, we've been sending Lisa's Leadership Updates each quarter that contains information with what's new at CHAI, a staff spotlight, advocacy updates and upcoming events.

2024 is sure to be an excellent year ahead with Ricki Shapiro taking the reins as President of the Board. She will continue to focus on the strategic plan goals including year-round fundraising efforts and taking our beloved organization to the next level.

CHAI's staff, families, board, donors and partners each play a key role in making CHAI such a wonderful organization. We sincerely want to thank you for trusting us to lead CHAI and our vision for CHAI's future.




